Battle of the Books practices have started with many grade levels. This program is geared to increasing academic performance with literacy.

Robotics class was able to meet with robotics teams from other parts of the State. This gave them an opportunity to try out new ideas and be inspired by champions from other areas. This is an academic topic geared to increasing student interest in the sciences and increasing academic performance.

Parent teacher conferences were held October 22 and 23 and we had a very good turnout at both schools.
