In 2019-2020, the number of students receiving an out of school suspension decreased. However, the percentage of students suspended who receive special education services increased.

In 2018-2019, the total number of English Learners in the district was 140. Therefore, 35.7% of district students were identified as English Learners. However, 50% of students receiving a suspension discipline consequence were English Learners. In 2019-2020, the total number of English Learners in the district was 120, resulting in 30.6% of district students being English Learners. While the overall percentage of English Learners in the district during the 2019-2020 school year decreased by 5.1%, the percentage of students receiving a suspension discipline consequence identified as English Learners increased by 10%.
