Kuspuk School District stakeholders were invited to participate and provide input during the 2020-2021 Consolidated Grant planning process. Due to COVID-19, a link to a google survey was distributed to solicit input. Individuals from each community across the district completed the survey which provided the grant planning team with excellent information. Additionally, DEED substantially approved the Consolidated Grant over the summer. Now, during the beginning of the school year, the budgets and line items will be adjusted to reflect additional allocations and carryover amounts.

Kuspuk School District recognizes the need to evaluate the district capacity and respond to the growing mental health needs of all students and provide mental health services to students across the district. Therefore, KSD proposes the development and implementation of the Student Health Intervention Program (SHIP). With a focus on promoting mental health awareness and prevention programming through an innovative, hybrid approach to screening, assessment, treatment interventions and services for students across the district. Grant funds will be used for the following purposes:

• Contract with a licensed clinical social worker.



- Administer an initial mental health survey and end-of-year program survey to all students.
- Analyze the data to develop a continuum of services to be provided across the district.
- Conduct individual and small group therapy sessions.
- Teletherapy sessions led by the school social worker.
- Talking circles facilitated by the school social worker, school representative, or SHIP appointed community member.

Kuspuk School District has partnered with DotCom Therapy to provide every student across the district access to exceptional therapy services.

PowerSchool Special Programs
