2. Call to order/Roll Call

3. Minutes—Agnes Sanford made a motion to skip the reading of the minutes and Taylor Hayden seconded it.
4. Principal and Staff Reports: Angela Hayden reported that students raised \$1095 for the Pennies for Patients for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society; The 3/4 Battle of the Books took 2nd Place, the 5/6 Teams took 3rd and 4th, and the MS Team took 1st; We have one student attending EXCEL 7/8 the end of February; SkiKu will be coming the last week of February; and the Robotics Team won the Innovation Award and will be traveling to Juneau for a conference paid by the First Lego League to help them connect with developers to help plan the implementation of their project. They will be applying for a possibility to win a trip to Orlando and \$20,000 to design and implement their project called “The Drunk Cam”. It is a technology designed to keep drunks from entering the school and ruining school events and harming our students. Application is due March 23. Angela also shared about all the extra help received this year from subs like Susan Hubbard, Zach Weidman, and Mark & Kathi Weidman. Sheree will be returning to the classroom February 27.
