Superintendent Report September 6, 2016

President Morgan, Board Members and others in attendance, I would like to highlight the following items as part of my report.

Our District schools welcomed students on August 24th and Pre-school on September 6th.

Enrollment: Enrollment figures from around the district show an increase from our spring projections. We had projected an enrollment of 331 students; as of Friday, September 2nd 337 students had been enrolled, not including pre-K. The largest increase is in each of the Kalskag schools. Currently our district totals are:

- Total K-6: 208
- Total 7-8: 42
- Total 9-12: 87
- Total pre-K: 61 (not included in the 337 count)

Maintenance: The maintenance department continues its work to solve the water pump issue at AJSHS. On September 6th a small hole in a fuel line to one of the furnaces at AMNES filled the school with oil fumes. The Maintenance department quickly repaired the fuel line. Vince Winters from the Aniak AC offered three large fans that were placed in the schools halls to help remove the fumes. All AMNES parents were contacted and made aware of the situation.

<u>New Staff:</u> We are currently accepting applications for a second teacher in Crooked Creek. The position has been posted internally and on ATP.

ELA Curriculum Committee: The committee is piloting Journeys in all grades at AMNES and Balanced Literacy in grades K-2 at JOGES. The committee will review data at their next meeting.

Online Classes: Due to Internet bandwidth issues the district is only able to offer on-line classes through AK Teach to high school students in Aniak and Kalskag. KSD students are taking currently 62 online classes.

<u>**Carnegie:**</u> Ninth grade students are currently enrolled in classes and are following a schedule that will lead to a 22-credit diploma in 2020.
