

WHAT:

Alaska's Education Challenge is an opportunity to inspire Alaskans to implement a vision to provide an excellent education for every student.

This will happen by:

- 1) Increasing Student Success;
- 2) Cultivating Safety and Well-Being; and
- 3) Supporting Responsible and Reflective Learners.

WHY:

Our system of public education isn't working for enough of our students. We have one of the largest achievement gaps in the country between our bottom performers and our average to top performers.

Statistics:

- Alaska has ranked in the bottom tier of our country in student achievement and graduation rate for far too
 many years. (NAEP results)
- One in six students in Alaska demonstrate kindergarten readiness skills. (ADP results)
- Last school year the statewide teacher turnover rate was one out of every eight teachers.
- Over one quarter of our students are chronically absent from school.
