Hello Superintendents and Board Presidents,

AASB has teamed up with the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) and NEA-Alaska to offer in-depth Interest Based Bargaining training this January. This training is not for the faint of heart – it is three days long – January 28, 29, and 30, 2020. If your district currently uses or is considering a collaborative bargaining approach or you want to expand your bargaining skills (regardless of the style of bargaining), this will be an excellent FREE training opportunity.

FMCS Commissioner Ligia Velazquez from Seattle will be heading up the training. Through a series of presentations, exercises, and activities, participants will learn how to translate positions into issues, share information, identify possible options that satisfy the needs of both parties and learn to develop criteria to assess options. The program is also designed to outline the basic knowledge, skills, and attitudes that you need to facilitate an interest based problem solving meeting. This includes information on adult learning, working styles, how to organize and run a meeting, and basic facilitation techniques. The training also provides activities that will give you an opportunity to acquire and develop skills related to planning and running effective meetings.

We know that cost is always a consideration in these fiscally challenging times AND you read it right, FMCS is providing this training at NO COST (your tax dollars are hard at work). The training will be in Anchorage so the cost of travel and lodging would be up to each district. Details on the training location will be shared once finalized. If you have any questions please call Norm, Timi or Lon at 907-463-1660. AASB will have a registration open the week of Nov. 11th.

The other exciting training we are offering is our newly added School Law day as part of our Winter Academy. The Winter Academy will be held Dec. 6 & 7, 2019 at the Crowne Plaza in Anchorage. The School Law Day draft agenda is attached but will focus on *The Business of Student Education in Alaska*. Many different lawyers, as well as Commissioner Johnson will present on Friday. Saturday's sessions will focus on issues including students in poverty, and the teacher shortage in Alaska. That agenda is still not complete. The registration for the Winter Academy will also open right after the annual conference.

We are constantly trying to add benefit to membership in AASB and hope both of these days be seen as such.
