

## **Title I & LEP Definitions**

### Who is a Title I Student?

A Title I Student is a student who has not yet demonstrated proficiency in Reading or Math as measured by the following:

- Grades K-3: Those students who are Not Proficient in Reading as measured by the English Language Proficiency Test
- Grades 4-10: Those students who are Not Proficient in Reading or Math as measured from the Spring SBA assessments
- Grades 11-12: Those who have not yet passed the Reading, Writing or Math sections of the HSGQE
- *For All students, teacher recommendations are also a part of the Title I identification.*

### Who is an LEP Student? (Limited English Proficient)

- An LEP student is a student who is not yet proficient in English as measured by the district and state English Language Proficiency Test. This assessment measures a student's understanding and use of English in a school setting in reading, writing, listening, speaking and comprehension.
- *For All students, the Parent Language Questionnaire and Teacher Language Observation Checklist, along with staff and principal recommendations, are also a part of the LEP identification.*
